## You'd be transformed into another world; the Arabian nights dream in the heart of the dunes

#### > DAY THREE

#### Today is a day of total Desert.

We will follow the tracks to Rissani\* to visit some of their Centenial Kasbahs. Visit the market, unique in these latitudes, where the tribes and desert nomads usually go. It is curious to see their parking of donkeys.

We will go over the tracks that were used in the Dakar rally, visiting villages and nomadic settlements of the desert. We will stop in the Marine Fossil Quarries, going back 360 million years, and we enjoy a picnic lunch in Tisserdimine Oasis, the place where the movie 'Sahara' was filmed.

We will continue up to the Big Erg Chebi Desert with dunes of fine sand then change our 4WD vehicle for camels, to enter into the heart of the dunes and watch an unforgettable sunset.

We will arrive by camel at our own Private Luxury camp where we will stay in Haimas tents made of camel skin like those used by nomadic people. Each tent includes its own private toilet and shower.

You will enjoy the typical "Mechui" roast lamb cooked in the traditional way and served in a Haima dining room with local folklore ... A true luxury in the middle of the desert served under the impressive amphitheater of stars.

For those wanting a little privacy, we can also organize a romantic dinner for two or more on top of one of the dunes.

#### > DAY FOUR

#### Today we have an 'Appointment with the Sunrise'.

We recommend you get up early to walk to the top of the Great Dune and see the sunrise.

Afterwards, we have breakfast before continuing our journey via 4WD, taking in the vast openness of the Sahara Desert, and explore Merdani, an abandoned village.

We will continue, visiting the Memphis Mines, near the border of Algeria.

Later on we will visit the village Khamlia where locals will treat us to their traditional dances, offering us local tea with mint.

Afterwards we return to Kasbah Xaluca where you can relax for the rest of the day.

Here you can enjoy an afternoon cocktail, dive into the pool, or soak in the jacuzzi.

Before dinner, we give you the choice of taking a Hamam or a massage or for the more adventurous ones the chance to ride a Quad around the dunes near the hotel.

#### > DAY FIVE

After breakfast, we will leave by road to Tinerhir, a small and prosperous town that offers a beautiful panorama of contrasts with its pink houses and palms. This is the best starting point to go into the famous Todra Gorges, where we will take a walk long the river course.

Later on we will continue to Boumalne Dades, a town located in the Valley of the Birds at an an altitude of 1612m in the High Atlas Mountains.

Tonight we appreciate nature, and enjoy comfort and relaxation in the middle of the valleys and mountains of the High Atlas, taking in panoramic views of the Dades Valley, sprinkled with friendly Berber villages and snowy peaks.

Our accommodation is a unique Hotel nestled high above the town, with welcoming traditional rooms, exquisitely decorated with materials from different African countries.

It is a true paradise in the middle of the mountains.

#### > DAY SIX

At this stage we have a long drive ahead as we make our way to Marrakech. We will be rewarded with some spectacular scenery, including a chance to explore At Ben Haddou Ksar, declared a World Heritage site by UNESCO and the scene of many film productions including Game of Thrones, Star Wars and Babel.

We will enjoy an amazing poolside lunch in a famous 5 star Hotel in the desert town of Ouarzazate, known as the Hollywood of Morocco.

We will cross Tizi-n-Tichka or Tichka Mountain port, the highest road pass in the country. Here we will leave the lunar landscape that will give way to the predominant colors of green and ochre as we arrive at our destination in the afternoon. We'll spend the evening in a 14th century traditional Moroccan Riad with dream rooms. This truly is a private oasis inside the Medina of Marrakech.

Once settled in you have the late afternoon to discover the unique Djemaa el-Fna Square. Around dusk, the square comes alive, full of reciters, fortune tellers, jugglers, tooth-pullers, dancers, snake charmers and more.

Later in the evening we meet up for a traditional Moroccan banquet and roof top drinks inside a famous Riad, quietly tucked away within the confusing labyrinth of Souks.

#### > DAY SEVEN

#### Toubkal Ascent Trek, day 1 // Marrakech - Imlil

Today we depart by car from Marrakech in the morning for a 90 minute drive south up the Moulay Brahim Gorges, perhaps visiting the Asni weekly market which runs every Saturday, then to Agersioual (1,600m), set in the upper foothills of the Western High Atlas mountains. Here you will leave the vehicle where we will meet our local guide prior to setting out for a 12km excursion on foot, heading east to the Berber village of AIkkiss (1,700m) and over Tizi n Agersioual Pass (2200m).

Lunch is taken inside a Berber Home (or by the river) before we carry on walking up the Imnane Valley then over Tizi n Tamter Pass (2779m).

From here you can view the two valleys, down into the Imlil Valley and back down to the Imnane Valley. Another 90 minute trek down from here will take you to the village of Imlil where you will enjoy an evening meal in the charming Kasbah Du Toubkal, awarded by National Geographic as one of the unique lodges of the world.

The delightful garden and large terraces are a perfect spot to unwind and soak up the unparalleled views of the surrounding mountains. You will be treated to friendly and knowledgeable local Berber hospitality ensuring your stay is a memorable experience.

#### > DAY EIGHT

#### Toubkal Ascent Trek, day 2 // Imlil - Sidi Chamharoush Toubkal Refuge

After breakfast we begin our trek, heading along the Mizane Valley, first towards the village of Aremd and then onto the shrine of Sidi Chamarouch. Built on a moraine spur overlooking the valley floor, Aremd is the largest village in the valley and provides an interesting mix of traditional terraced farming, gites and streets that seem to be permanently gridlocked by goats and cattle.

For generations the local Berber villagers have worked these lands, producing corn, potatoes and walnuts from the harsh landscape.

Continuing east and crossing the flood plain our route takes us along mule tracks and up into the high rocky cliffs above the valley. Crossing the river we eventually come to the pastoral shrine of Sidi Chamarouch, which attracts tourists and pilgrims alike (although only Muslims are allowed to cross the stone bridge to visit the Marabout Shrine itself). The village sits besides a small waterfall, a jumbled cluster of houses that seem to melt together into an anarchic mass. From here the trail continues to climb steadily, snaking and zig zagging its way up to the snow line and the Toukbal Refuge (3206m), our stop for the night.

Early to bed tonight for our final climb in the morning.

## Revitalize your mind and body and challenge yourself in the pristine surrounds of the Atlas Mountains

#### > DAY NINE

#### Toubkal Ascent Trek, day 3 // Trek to summit Jebel Toubkal (4165m); return to Imlil - Marrakech

Early this morning we make our attempt for the summit of Jebel Toukbal, the highest peak in Northern Africa. Our route takes us up the south cirque, crossing the stream above the refuge and then heading across one of the mountains numerous scree fields, where we will have to negotiate a seemingly endless carpet of boulders and rocks.

The walking is relatively straightforward, but the scree and the altitude will make the going quite difficult in parts, however, the views along the way make the journey more than worthwhile.

Cresting the ridge line we find ourselves on the plateau, from where it is a short walk to the summit and the vistas out across the surrounding landscape.

From here there are unrestricted, magnificent views in every direction, from the Marrakech Plain to the High Atlas in the north and as far south as the Anti-Atlas and the Sahara.

Pliny, the great Roman scholar, once described the High Atlas Mountains as the most fabulous mountains in all of Africa and from our vantage point high above the valley it is easy to understand why.

Retracing our steps we then return down the mountain and head back to Imlil before driving back to Marrakech. Tonight we arrive at our own dedicated 10 acre private Estate, consisting of 3 free standing palatial homes, impressive grounds, full security and resort style pool.

Our staff will prepare an outdoor barbecue banquet on the lawn, complete with local food and drinks.

Traditional entertainment with Moroccan dance will feature this evening as we celebrate our climb of Toubkal.

#### > DAY ELEVEN

#### As the trip nears an end, we have a special treat planned.

Today we rise early, and meet our pilot, before gracefully setting off and drifting across Marrakech in our hot air balloon, gracing you with spectacular views of the Atlas Mountains and the thriving red city below.

Once on the ground, you can indulge in an impressive spread of fresh bread, baked delicacies, fruit, crepes and coffee.

Afterwards, we head into the Medina, where we check into the most outstanding 16th century Riad, tucked away inside a narrow Souk. Without vehicle access, our concierge will meet us to take your luggage as they escort us through the maze of narrow, terracotta toned alleys.

Once entering the impressive carved timber door, you are sure to be taken back as you admire this stunning representation of Moroccan architecture.

Taking some time out to unwind, how you plan to take on the afternoon is completely up to you.

You will have the choice to join a planned tour of some of the sights including the 16th century Saadian Tombs, local museums or the Koutoubia Mosque.

The Jemaa el-Fnaa, being the central market place, comes alive in the late afternoon and just simply soaking up the atmosphere is a must do, with snake charmers, storytellers, dancers and slick shop touts all vying for your attention amid the bustling sounds, smells and colour that vividly encapsulate Morocco's vibrant soul.

## A few travel tips for Morocco

#### Climate

Remember, depending on which time of the year you travel, Morocco can be extremely hot. During the summer months, between June and August, temperatures can soar above 40 degrees. April and October are cooler, whilst November through to March can still experience warm conditions however cooler evenings.

#### Bartering

As many of the shops, particularly in the markets don't have fixed prices, learning to barter will serve you well. it is a great way to meet and have fun with the you are willing to pay, and don't be unreasonable for the sake of a few dollars.

#### Dress culture

Being an Arabic country, it is important that you respect religious and local customs. Wearing light weight clothing, and covering the knees and shoulders is a good tip. Not only does this provide protection from the harsh sun, and avoid unwanted looks, but it also shows that you understand and respect the culture, which in turn gain you a greater respect. Long pants and shirt MUST be worn in places of worship. Carrying a scarf or shawl comes in handy for covering up or reprieve from the sun.

#### Language

Arabic, Berber and French are the main languages you will hear. English is becoming popular, but be prepared to brush up on a few local phrases or be creative.

#### Safety

As with most countries, you need to take care when in crowded areas as pick pocketing and bag snatching can occur. Moroccans are friendly, but it pays to be careful of over-friendly locals.





#### Alcohol

Morocco allows the consumption of alcohol. Alcohol must be purchased and consumed in licensed hotels, bars, and tourist areas.

#### Currency

The local cash is the Moroccan Dirham. One Australian dollar is worth approximately 6.5 Dirhams.

#### Payment

Many businesses accept cash only. There are currency exchanges and ATMs available, although the machines are not always reliable. Hotels and larger stores accept credit cards.

#### Fridays are holy days

Muslims observe holy days on Fridays, meaning many locals attend the mosques to pray. This can affect business hours.

#### Wifi / mobile phone access

You have the choice of data roaming, which is expensive, or obtaining a local SIM card, which we can arrange for you. The 4G network is quite reliable in many areas.

#### Taking Photographs

Morocco is a photographer's paradise but be careful when taking photographs of people. Always ask permission. Often this will involve a small payment.

#### Punctuality

Remember things, including schedules can be quite relaxed in Morocco. Just go with the flow, chill and accept this laid back way of life.



#### >> Terms & Conditions

INITIAL

**1) Booking Form:** By You completing the Booking Form, submitting it to EO, and EO's acceptance of it by written reply, You agree to the terms and conditions contained in this document to the exclusion of all other terms and conditions not in this document, unless they are set out in the Booking Form, and/or otherwise agreed to in writing by You and EO (the parties).

**2) Prior dealings and variations:** Any prior dealings between the parties and the terms and conditions that apply to those dealings do not apply to the Adventure. Any variation of these Terms and Conditions must be agreed in writing by You and EO and, in the case of EO, the signatory must be duly authorized by EO to agree to the relevant variation.

**3) Price:** the price of the Adventure is outlined in the Trip Notes or has otherwise been notified to You in writing. The inclusions for the Adventure are listed in the Trip Notes. The price quoted is in AUD dollars and is payable by cash or direct deposit into EO's nominated bank account. You will be liable for all bank charges that may be levied on direct deposits. Every endeavour will be made by EO not to change the Price. However, if there is a change to the exchange rate or local conditions, EO reserves the right to change the Price.

**4) Timing to Payment:** Unless otherwise agreed in writing, the Price is payable as follows:

a) 30% at the time You submit the Booking Form to EO; and

b) The balance no later than 30 days prior to the first day of the Adventure, or such other date as EO in its absolute discretion may agree (i.e. Where You book the Adventure closer to the first day of Adventure); or
c) If the Booking Form is submitted to EO within the 90 day period prior to the first day of Adventure, the Price is payable at the time the Booking Form is submitted, or such other date as EO in its absolute discretion may agree.

**5) Transfer:** if You book for this Adventure and decide to transfer to another adventure with EO that is at that time advertised by EO and the start date of that other adventure is not more than 12 months after the start date of this Adventure, then EO will agree to transfer your payment across to the new Adventure provided that your written notice of the change is received no later than 90 days prior to the date that the Adventure You initially booked was due to start or such other date as EO in its absolute discretion may agree.

#### 6) Cancellation by You:

**2) Warranties and representations:** You warrant and represent to EO that:

challenging trekking at high altitudes and You have satisfied yourself that You have the requisite skills and experience necessary for You to participate in the Adventure or You will ensure that You have the requisite skills and experience prior to the day of the Adventure:

h) It may or may not be possible for You to insure yourself in relation to the Adventure, including the high altitude aspects of the Adventure;

i) You have made all due and independent enquiries in adventure travel, high altitude trekking and expeditions similar to the Adventure; and
j) During the Adventure, You will follow the instructions of the Guide leading the Adventure, noting that those instructions in many circumstances will relate to the safety and wellbeing of participants in the Adventure.

**10)** Adventure Guides: EO will nominate a suitably experienced Guide to lead your Adventure. However, EO reserves the right at any time to change the nominated Guide and replace that Guide with another suitably experienced Guide. You may not claim any costs, loss, damages (whether direct or indirect) or refund from EO for any change to an Adventure Guide or any other staff engaged by EO for your Adventure.

**10) Exclusion from Adventure (health and fitness):** if for any reason, the Guide, as nominated by EO, considers, in the Guide's absolute discretion, that You should not participate in the Adventure for reasons associated with your health and wellness, despite You having obtained a medical clearance to do so, the Guide may exclude You from the Adventure, either before or during the Adventure. If on such grounds the Guide excludes You from the Adventure before the Adventure commences, then any refund will be in accordance with condition 6 as if You had cancelled during the timeframes stated in that clause. 'Recreational services' is defined as including activities that involve a significant degree of physical exertion or risk undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure. These guarantees mean that EO, its officers, servants, agents or assigns, as the supplier, is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to You are rendered with due care and skill and are fit for their intended purpose.

b) Under Australian Consumer Law, EO, its officers, servants, agents or assigns, as supplier, is entitled to ask You to agree that these statutory guarantees will not apply to You. 26) Interpretation: 'include' or 'including' is to be read without limitation.27) Severance: If any part of these Terms and Conditions are found to be illegal, unenforceable or invalid, then the relevant part will be severed un-less to do so would cause the Terms and Conditions to be frustrated.
